We have engaged a Paddleboard instructor to offer 2 x "Ready to Ride" lessons during OPEN DAY. Places will cost £35 per member for a


2-hour session, 10.00-12.00 or 14.00 -16.00 Max 6 places per course. (Am/pm courses maybe combined subject to sufficient

Safety Boat...

Once again we're striving to promote familiarisation of the safety boat and equipment to as many members as possible, allowing the safe operation of their required SB Duty during the season.

Not completed a SB Fam day yet? Our Bosun Syd, has kindly offered his time over 4 x Saturdays in March to provide refresher and training days to any members....New or old!

SB Duty is essential for the safe running of sailing, water activities and events at the club.

All full members are required to volunteer for at least 2 duties each season as a Crew or a Helm.

Familiarisation training bookings are now available on our club booking system **HERE**.

SB Fam days are free of charge, but will only run subject to filling 2 places on each course.







Following some interesting variations on how to secure the outboards in Robinson, we have standardised the fastenings across all engines, the lock and strop should be secured to the securing eye on the outboard motor, see images, please use this method to secure the outboards rather than some intricate design of your own.

From our Bosun...

During the winter we have made attempts at securing member's boats and covers as the winds have been a bit feisty.

We suggest that all members should check their boats regularly, the heavy rainfall has caused the boat park to be very wet and muddy and as a consequence, a number of tie down points have become loose and pulled out of their mooring points by the strong winds, impacting several boat covers, some now beyond repair.



Warning....Be aware when undoing your covers as we have found numerous large wasps over-wintering and they can get a bit annoyed at being disturbed!

The outboard motors are scheduled for service at the end of February and we will have all the club boats ready for the new sailing season. During the winter we have carried out a minor repairs, with some remaining fibre-glass work outstanding on one of our club Wanderers....A job for warmer weather.

The two club model yachts are now stored on a shelf above the bench in the Robinson building, all the kit is there, a handy step ladder by the bucket of oars is on hand to enable you to safely get the model boats out and return them to storage.

NB Any member can hire out the Yachts following an induction process, organised by David and Simon. All signed off members will be able to book RC Yacht boats on the booking system.

The club is committed to train safety boat helms and crew members to RYA PB-2 level as part of our forward development plan. An introduction to full Power boat certification is through our SB Fam days, however a full RYA Power Boat course - PB-2 is run over 2 days, including practical and theory training in all aspects of handling, and is a great opportunity to gain a recognised qualification and skill.

The certification also allows a holder to hire craft throughout the UK, with a possible conversion to ICC, recognised abroad.

We will be announcing plans and dates to run a PB-2 course during the 2024 season. Places will be limited and also subsidised.

If you haven't yet volunteered for service, it is essential you spend a day with our Bosun - Syd, who kindly gives up his time to offer free training days to any member free of charge, The day covers basic rescue techniques, use of the safety boat and the equipment required to carry out SB Duties.

We'll be holding you to those ambitions! - Ed




I have been hooked on dinghy sailing since being introduced to Bosun dinghies in the Royal Navy in the late

2024 Sailing programme

Sailing schedule 2024

It is intended that the racing schedule for 2024 will follow and learn from our experiences of 2023 season which saw 40 of the 79 scheduled races completed with 9 different race winners.

The number of Sundays dedicated to the Kick Start series will be reduced to two Sundays, the 7th and 14th April starting at 10:30.

The Sail Planning team are willing to provide instruction on Boat Setup, Race Starts, Mark Rounding, Race Officer, Race Day Organisation, Racing Rules through to "how to join your first race". Please let us know what you would like to see included in these two sessions by emailing your thoughts/requests to sailingsee@thoughts.

Wednesday evening Sunset series

Will again be split into two series of 10 races each. The first race of the Early Sunset series will be on Wednesday 24th April starting at 18:30. The race format will be the standard handicap race using the RYA Portsmouth Yardstick with the Race Officer deciding the course on the evening.

There will be a **Sunday AM** series of 11 races starting at 11:00 on Sunday 21st April. This Sunday AM series will be split with two Pursuit Races at 11:00 on Sunday the 2nd and 9th June and then recommence on Sunday the 16th June.

Two races on **Sunday afternoons** are planned, starting with the Spring Series of 12 races starting on Sunday 21st April with the first race at 14:00. It is expected that the two races will be sailed back to back

The Sunday afternoon Summer series of 14 races will start on Sunday 2nd June.

The **Commodore's Cup** will be held on: 18th August followed by the **Autumn series** which will have 10 races with one race at 11:00 and the second race at 14:00 starting on Sunday 1st September.

The Autumn series will be split to include the Fusion Trophy on the 8th September and the Laser Trophy on the 22nd September.

NB - There will be no scheduled Sunday Racing from the 28th July until the 18th August as experience has shown that school holidays and National Championships significantly reduces our pool of racers.

Most racing involves a mass start and then finish times are adjusted by the Portsmouth Yardstick to determine the winner, often seeing sailors head for home without knowing the results.

On the 2nd and 9th June there will be **Pursuit races** with the slowest boats starting at 11:00 and the remaining boats starting depending on their handicap aiming for all boat to finish at 11:45. The result meaning places on the water at 11:45 determines the winner. This is a great format and well worth trying or even watching!

National Schools Sailing Association (NSSA) Regatta at Bassenthwaite Sailing Club

This is a great event and one, many adult supporters of NEYYSA enjoyed themselves as teenagers.

Open to all sailors under the age of 19 on 1 September 2024 and to any class of monohull dinghy.

The Notice of Race NOR has not yet been published as plans are still being worked by the NSSA and Bassenthwaite SC.....However, based on previous years there is likely to be a Topper, ILCA 4 and ILCA6 fleet and a general mixed handicap fleet.

There will also be a regatta fleet for less experienced racers.
