Safety boat duty is an integral part of the volunteer ethos of the club....All single and family members are required to complete a minimum of 2 x SB duties during the season, even if you're only intending to use the club for Paddleboarding or Kayaking, all memberships enjoy the full facilities of the club, so, there is a trade off and a requirement to step up for your Safety Boat duty!

Our Bosun, Syd Nye, runs SB familiarisation days throughout the season, and it is important that all volunteers complete a session with Syd to understand all aspects of the TSSC Safety Boat duty, including boat handling and equipment preparation.....Plus w hizzing around the water in the powerboat is great fun!

The SB-Fam course is free, based on 2 members per session, so a really useful day on/off the water learning the ropes (and knots and other stuff too!). Book a session with Syd, through our booking page here





Non-payers will be asked to walk the plank!



From our Bosuns

Bob has repaired both club Wanderers, all the kit is in the boats and ready to go. Hire through the booking system.

Currently all the Toppers have training sails fitted to the masts, we've been using the craft for the youth sailing courses, however, if you want to use a Topper with a full sail, you can find the full size sails on the Topper shelf. Remove the training sail (put it on the shelf in it's bag) and fit the full sail.

Following the theft of the Suzuki Outboard, we have trialled the 10hp Honda engine on the Blue boat and surprisingly, it was a success, far more stable than the stolen engine, however we recommend using the Blue boat for instructors and assisting with training only.

We have been gifted a Laser if anyone is interested, it is currently in the trailer park. It's the yellow Laser that hasn't been used for a few years. We have all the kit for it and it is sailable.



A quick reminder....

May we ask that if you are using the Club boats please launch and recover from the slipway, the water level has dropped dramatically, therefore rocks are exposed with a risk of damage away from the slipway, and we would rather no more damage to the boats.

With welfare in mind....

From our Welfare Officer....

Use of changing facilities when young people are on site.

When youth courses are taking place at the club or when families are present, changing facilities and use of toilets needs to be separate for adults and children/young people.

During youth courses the changing rooms in the clubhouse are for the use of youths only please.

All adults must use the annexe changing & toilet facilities. Any child / young person who is not on the course may use the clubhouse changing rooms alongside the young people on the course.

Similarly when families are at the club, adults who are not related to children/young people should not be present in changing

spaces at the same time as the children/young people.

Children or parents changing with children are therefore asked to use the annexe facilities.

First Aid Training

On 8th June 4 x TSSC sailors and a visitor from Yorkshire Dales SC did the RYA First Aid course at the club.

The trainer was Ellie Meadows. During



the course of the day she taught us how to assess a casualty, and how to deal with injuries including choking, head injuries, concussion, stroke, cold water shock, burns and fractures.

We practised applying bandages to each other, putting the 'casualty' in the recovery position and administering CPR - fortunately for this we were able to practise on dummies rather than each other!

Ellie's teaching methods were superb, she made the course very relevant to us and overall gave us the confidence to 'have a go' if we do find ourselves in a situation where First Aid is required.

She gave us some helpful mnemonics to help remember key points. The course is a requirement for instructors but 2 of us did it simply to acquire new skills & knowledge. I thoroughly enjoyed the day, learned a

thoroughly enjoyed the day, learned a lot and do now feel equipped to put my new found skills into use.

It is hoped that the course will be run at TSSC again and I would encourage anyone who doesn't have first aid training to do it.

reservoirs with weed, affect fish and diminish our enjoyment of nature.

As users of a drinking water reservoir we have a real responsibility to protect Thornton Steward from the import of water weeds, killer shrimp, crayfish and more.

At this time of year boats are being moved about for competitions and holidays; SUPs and kayaks are affected too.

If you are bringing or returning equipment to TSSC that wasn't washed down at the last body of water it was used on, you must wash it down on arrival at the club.

Please use the area behind the annexe and the hose reel which is in Trevor's shed.

The 2000 Class Nationals were held at the Royal Torbay YC - a big deal for Trevor as honourable Class President. The class certainly knows how to put on a championship and make it truly family friendly. With several previous champions absent from the field it was a chance for new teams
